## Reopening K-12 Schools at RSU 18

## Considerations and Recommendations that support the reopening of our schools

The Maine Department of Education has developed guidance to support districts and communities in determining their plans and strategies for reopening schools.

This approach is built upon the guidance and recommendations of health officials; it is strongly aligned to the reopening guidelines that have been provided by our state and federal leaders; and it's designed to help districts prioritize the health and safety of students and teachers as they open school buildings and deliver instruction for the 2020-2021 school year.

Regional School Unit No. 18 has developed a systemic approach to reopening our schools based on the guidance from local health officials, the Maine Center for Disease Control (MCDC), the Maine Department of Education, the American Academy of Pediatrics, our professional staff who served on collaborative committees to identify a safe approach to opening schools, and parent feedback from surveys and district-wide parent meetings.



### **Transporting**



### **District/School Considerations:**

- Provide hand sanitizer for students and bus drivers
- Follow any state mandates requiring face covering to be worn on buses.
- Limit field trips (to areas of limited/low transmission)
- Inspect buses prior to students returning and as part of a regular rotation
- Clean frequently touched surfaces on the bus at least daily
- Air out buses when not in use

### **District/School Considerations:**

- Provide hand sanitizer for students and bus drivers
- Provide face coverings for bus drivers and students and require anyone riding a bus to wear face covering.
- Ask students (parents) to use a screening tool for symptoms of illness prior to boarding the bus
- Utilize spaced seating (to the extent practicable)
- Eliminate field trips
- Clean frequently touched surfaces on the bus

# Entering Schools



### **District/School Considerations:**

- Provide hand sanitizer for students and staff

  Educate staff and students on strategies to curb the spread of COVID-19. COVID-19 symptoms, preventative measures (including staying home

Limit unnecessary congregations of students

- preventative measures (including staying home when sick), good hygiene, and school/district specific protocols
- Establish a protocol for students/staff who feel ill/experience symptoms when they come to school
- Isolate and send home if temperature is over 100.4°F
- Establish a protocol for visitors: calling front office before entering, screening visitors, etc.

### **District/School Considerations:**

- Educate staff and students on strategies to curb the spread of COVID-19. COVID-19 symptoms, preventative measures (including staying home when sick), good hygiene, and school/district specific protocols
- Ask students (parents) to use a screening tool for symptoms of illness prior to entering school
- Isolate and send home if temperature is over 100.4°F
- Consider safety and privacy concerns (confidentiality should be maintained)
- Establish a protocol for visitors: Restrict nonessential visitors in the building, calling front office before entering, screening any approved visitors, etc.
- Establish a protocol for student pick/drop up: staggered entry and release (by grade, class, or bus numbers), marked spacing for pickup

### **District/School Considerations:**

- Virtual tools and platforms will be used by district staff to deliver instruction.
- Exceptions for students to be in a school building will only be made by district administrators.

Serving Meals	District/School Considerations:  Allow time for student hand washing before and after meal service Provide hand sanitizer for students and staff conduct cleaning of cafeterias and high-touch surfaces throughout the school day	District/School Considerations:  Allow time for student hand washing before and after meal service Provide hand sanitizer for students and staff Use disposable plates, utensils, when students are eating in their classrooms Monitor serving lines and traffic paths to ensure spacing Conduct cleaning of cafeterias and high-touch surfaces throughout the school day Utilize alternative serving models and locations to increase social distancing when applicable	Practice established social distancing protocols to the greatest extent practicable Have meals available-during a designated time at our meal sites
Transitioning	District/School Considerations:  Conduct cleaning of hallways and high-touch surfaces throughout the school day  Designate areas of the hallway (i.e. lanes) to walk to keep students separated (to the extent practicable)	District/School Considerations:  Limit mixing between groups (to the extent practicable)  For class changes and other transitions throughout the school day, consider using strategies to reduce crowding to the extent possible. Some examples may be:  Designate areas of the hallway (i.e. lanes) as flow paths to keep students separated students to minimize congregation of students  Plan staggered class (ex: by hall, odd/even room numbers, grade/ discipline) changes to decrease number of students in hallways at one time  Have the same group of students stay with the same staff (all day for young children and as much as feasible for older children)	School buildings are closed to students.  Any exceptions must be approved by district administration.

## Supporting Teaching and Learning



### **District/School Considerations:**

- Provide hand sanitizer for students and staff
- Conduct cleaning of classrooms and high touch surfaces each day
- Limit physical interaction through partner or group work
- Develop a formative assessment calendar
- Support the development of grade level academic topics
- Provide additional instructional supports to:
  - students at-risk of not graduating on time
  - students with disabilities
  - students who struggled in the prior distance/remote learning environment

#### **District/School Considerations:**

- The Hybrid instructional model may be requested of families who prefer not to send their students to school in the traditional setting in certain circumstances.
- Utilize either Seesaw (pre k grade 2) or Google Classroom (grades 3 -12) to facilitate any remote learning
- Balance class numbers as much as possible remove unused desks and furniture in classrooms; maximize social distancing (to the extent practicable)
- Limit physical interaction through partner or group work
- Establish a 6 foot distance between the teacher's desk/board and students' desks
- Identify and utilize large spaces (i.e. gymnasiums, auditoriums, outside spaces – as weather permits) for social distancing

### **District/School Considerations:**

- Implement a Distance Learning Plan
- Utilize either Seesaw (pre k grade
   2) or Google Classroom (grades 3 12) to facilitate remote learning
- Provide technology tools and support to families

When a Child, Staff Member, or Visitor Becomes Sick at School



### **District/School Considerations:**

- Work with school administrators, school nurses, and other healthcare providers to identify an isolation room or area to separate anyone who exhibits COVID-like symptoms.
- Notify local health officials of a possible case.
- Close off areas used by a person identified as testing positive for COVID 19 and do not use before cleaning and disinfection.
- Inform those who have had close contact to a person diagnosed with COVID-19 to follow CDC guidance if symptoms develop
- Any student or staff member who is diagnosed by a physician to have tested positive for COVID-19 will be required to self-isolate for 10 days with at least 24 hours being symptom free
